Our most commonly asked questions and their answers!

Q. Will I be in a class right for my French level?

A. Yes, before camp we ask parents to give us as much information as possible about your level of French. If we haven't got it quite right, on Monday morning, everyone takes part in a small evaluation to help make those final changes.

Q. My brother/sister is at camp too, will I see them?

A. Yes! You have plenty of chance at break and lunchtimes to see siblings and friends in different groups.

Q. What happens if I don't want to take part in an activity?

A. We encourage everyone to 'give it a go!' If you have tried and you are unable to take part for any reason, just talk to us and we will find a solution!

Q. Something has gone wrong - who do I talk to?

A. You can talk to any adult you feel comfortable talking to at camp. This could be your teacher, a classroom assistant, Jo, Janneke or Christelle. We really encourage you to chat to us if there is ever an issue.

Q. I really want to upgrade to Day Camp - can I?

A. Yes! As long as we have a free space, we will always try our best to make your experience at camp the best possible. You just have to ask!

Q. Oops! I've forgotten something - what do I do?

A. Let a member of staff know as soon as possible! The sooner the better as it gives us time to contact your parents and wait for them to be able to drop the item off.



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
